

Study of the “Unholy Trinity” and 666

Who is an antichrist?

We are! We are all type of antichrists to some degree. Every time we swear with the name of Jesus, we are anti-Jesus. Whenever we disrespect God’s law and Ten Commandments, we are anti-God. Each time we participate in antisemitism by mistreating, hating, persecuting, and killing His “Chosen People,” we oppose “the King of Jews”—Christ the Messiah. Because the Devil has a deep inner hatred for God and His righteousness, he tries in vain to destroy Jesus Christ (God).



*“Beloved, **do not believe every spirit**, but **test the spirits**, whether they are of God; because many **false prophets** have gone out into the world. By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that **confesses** that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh [human] **is of God** and every spirit that **does not confess** that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh **is not of God**. This is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is **now** [first century—John’s time] already in the world” (1 John 4:1-3).*

First Antichrist types:

Antiochus IV Epiphanes—ruled 175 B.C. to 164 B.C.

The Greek king of the Seleucid Empire is the first type of the final Antichrist of antichrists. He did extreme disrespect against God. Antiochus was prophesied in the book of Daniel who would persecute the Jews, erect idols, desecrate the temple, and perform an “abomination of desolation” (sacrifice pigs on the Temple altar to his god Zeus). It was direct defiance and sacrilege against God.

Herod the Great—ruled 37 BCE to 4 BCE

The King of Judea Herod tried to kill baby Jesus and ordered the massacre of innocent infants in Bethlehem.

- Upon hearing from the Magi that a new “King of the Jews” was born, he feared the child would challenge his reign.
- He ordered the killing of all male children in Bethlehem and the surrounding area who were two years old and under.
- The infant Jesus was taken to Egypt by Joseph and Mary to escape the massacre and returned after Herod’s death.

Some accused of being the Antichrist

Roman Emperor Nero, Napoleon Bonaparte, Adolf Hitler, Vladimir Putin, world leaders, U. S. Presidents like F. D. Roosevelt, Barack Obama, and Donald Trump, and even popes were falsely accused of being the Antichrist. Some are precursors of the final Antichrist. Some accusation are misinformation, deception, political hate warfare, or just to incite and spread confusion.

Some Bible scholars believe that Donald Trump is more of an instrument of God, like Cyrus, than being the Antichrist. “*Thus says the Lord to His anointed, to **Cyrus**, whose right hand I have held—to subdue nations before him*” (Isa. 45:1). King Cyrus of Persia helped the Hebrews by issuing a decree that allowed the Jewish exiles in Babylon to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple.

The Antichrist of antichrists

Jesus is the King of Kings and Lord of lords. So, there’s a Antichrist of antichrists, foremost who fulfills all the biblical prophecies. The sum total of all the spiritual cells (antichrists of the world) are in the body of the “**Beast**, who rises out of the Sea (evil worldly people)”. These Antichrist people will be marked with “666” on their right hand or forehead, showing loyalty to the Antichrist.

Where does “The Antichrist” come from?

According to the Book of Daniel, the statue revealed to King Nebuchadnezzar has **Babylon** empire as the head, **Persia** as the shoulder and arms, **Greece** as the belly and thighs, **Rome** as the legs, and finally state-church kingdoms as its foot and 10 toes (10 kings). The Antichrist conquers three of the 10 kings and unite them into an eighth kingdom. So, logically a king of this new combined kingdom will arise from the old statue of European or Middle Eastern kingdoms as the Antichrist of antichrists.

The False Prophet of false prophets

The **Antichrist** and **False Prophet** team will be a like the World War 2 partners of **Hitler** and Grand Mufti **Al Hussein**. One was a very powerful political leader, while the other was a religious leader. Both had a deep hatred for Israel and Jews. They’ll also persecute Jewish allies, such as Christians and Israel supporters.

On 1 March 1944, while speaking on Radio Berlin, Al Hussein said: “**Arabs, rise as one man and fight for your sacred rights. Kill the Jews wherever you find them. This pleases God (Allah), history, and religion (Islam). This saves your honor. God is with you.**”

Al Hussein was referring to **Quran 2:191** about killing enemies.



How Satan, Antichrist, False Prophet, and Mark of the Beast work together

- **Satan** gives power to the **Antichrist** (Rev. 13:2: “The dragon gave the beast his power and his throne and great authority”).
- The **False Prophet** serves the Antichrist, directing worship toward him and enforcing the **Mark of the Beast** (Rev. 13:12-16).
- The **Mark** is the practical means by which the Antichrist’s (and Satan’s) dominion is exercised over humanity.

2. Antichrist

Definition: The Antichrist is a human figure (or possibly a system in some interpretations) who opposes Christ and deceives people by mimicking His authority. The term "**antichrist**" literally means "**against Christ**" or "in place of Christ."

Scriptural Basis:

- **1 John 2:18:** "Dear children, this is the last hour; and as you have heard that the antichrist is coming, even now many anti-christs have come." (Suggests both a singular figure and a broader spirit of opposition.)
- **2 Thes. 2:3-4:** "The man of lawlessness... will oppose and will exalt himself over ... God ... proclaiming himself to be God."

3. False Prophet

Definition: The False Prophet is a secondary figure who supports the Antichrist, promoting his worship and deceiving people through miraculous signs. Often seen as a **religious leader** or propagandist.

Scriptural Basis:

- **Rev. 13:11-14:** "Then I saw a second beast, coming out of the earth... It exercised all the authority of the first beast on its behalf, and made the earth and its inhabitants worship the first beast ... It performed great signs."
- **Rev. 19:20:** "But the beast was captured, and with it the false prophet who had performed the signs on its behalf."
- **Role:** The False Prophet enforces the Antichrist’s rule, particularly by compelling people to take the Mark of the Beast (Rev. 13:16-17). He’s like a lieutenant, amplifying the Antichrist’s influence through deception and miracles.

4. Mark of the Beast

The Mark of the Beast Angle

If Trump's the Antichrist and Musk the False Prophet, what's the Mark? Some speculate Musk's Neuralink or X's potential as a financial platform could evolve into a control system akin to Rev. 13:16-17. But as of now, no such mark exists—no mandatory chip or ID tied to Trump's leadership or Musk's tech that prevents buying and selling without it.
